Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Northern Territory Acceptance Act 1910-1919 and the Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the McMillan Mortgage Short title. Validating Ordinance 1922.*
- 2. The mortgage executed on the twenty-sixth day of validation of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, by Isabella mortgages and discharge. Jane McMillan over section five hundred and eighty, town of Darwin, county of Palmerston, of which she was proprietor, in favour of the Workmen's Dwellings Board to secure an advance made to her by certain officers of the Administration of the Northern Territory purporting to act for the said Board and the discharge dated the fourth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, of the said mortgage together with the further mortgage executed on the seventeenth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, by Isabella Jane McMillan over section five hundred and eighty, town of Darwin, county of Palmerston, of which she was proprietor, in favour of the Workmen's Dwellings Board, to secure an advance made to her by certain officers of the Administration of the Northern Territory purporting to act for the said Board, shall be deemed to be of the same force and effect as if the Workmen's Dwellings Ordinance 1919 had been proclaimed to commence prior to the twenty-sixth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, and the Workmen's Dwellings Board had been duly constituted under the said Ordinance prior to that date, and Ernest Macgregor Christie, Government Secretary, Edward Copley Playford, Director of Lands, and Charles Matthew Clark, Acting Superintendent of Public Works, had been duly authorized to sign the discharge of the mortgage of the twentysixth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and twenty.
