HOSPITALS AND MEDICAL SERVICES (CHARGES) REGULATIONS*

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Hospitals and Medical Services (Charges) Regulations.*

Commencement.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1955.

Interpretation. Sub-reg. (1.) substituted by 1963, No. 1.

- 3.—(1.) In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - (a) "in-patient" means a person who occupies a bed in a hospital for the purposes of treatment;
 - (b) "out-patient" means a person who receives a medical service at a hospital other than as an in-patient; and
 - (c) "the Ordinance" means the Hospitals and Medical Services Ordinance 1953-1962.

Note 1.-Regulation 1 of Regulations 1957, No.1, reads as follows:-

"1. These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of March, 1957"

Note 2.—Regulation 1 of Regulations 1958, No. 17, reads as follows:—

"1. These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1959."

Note 3.- Regulations 1958, No. 19, read as follows:-

- "Notwithstanding anything contained in regulation 1 of Regulations 1958, No. 17-
 - (a) the rates of charges prescribed by regulation 5 of the Hospitals and Medical Services (Charges) Regulations as in force on the first day of November, 1958, continue to apply—

 - (i) in the case of a person admitted as an in-patient in an obstetric ward—up to and including the thirty-first day of October, 1959; and
 (ii) in any other case—up to and including the twenty-eighth day of February, 1959; and
 - (b) the rates of charges prescribed by regulation 5 of the Hospitals and Medical Services (Charges) Regulations as amended by Regulations 1958, No. 17 shall apply-
 - (i) in the case of a person admitted as an in-patient in an obstetric ward—on and after the first day of November, 1959; and
 - (ii) in any other case—on and after the first day of March, 1959."

Note 4.—Regulation 1 of Regulations 1963, No. 1, reads as follows:-

- -(1.) The rates of charges prescribed by regulation 5 of the Hospitals and Medical Services (Charges) Regulations as in force immediately before the commencement of these Regulations shall continue to apply
 - (a) in the case of a person admitted as an in-patient in an obstetric bed—up to and including the thirtieth day of September, 1963; and
 (b) in any other case—up to and including the thirty-first day of January, 1963.
- "(2.) The rates of charges prescribed by regulation 5 of the Hospitals and Medical Services (Charges) Regulations as amended by these Regulations shall apply-
 - (a) in the case of a person admitted as an in-patient in an obstetric bed—on and after the first day of October, 1963; and
 - (b) in any other case—on and after the first day of February, 1963.
- "(3.) Regulations 4, 7, 8 and 9 of these Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of February, 1963."
- Regulations 4, 7 and 8 of Regulations 1963, No. 1, affected regulations 6, 10 and the First Schedule to the Principal Regulations, respectively.

(2.) For the purposes of these Regulations—

- (a) the day of admission to a hospital and the day of discharge from the hospital, or the day of his death where the person dies in hospital, shall be counted together as one day; and
- (b) a child under the age of twelve months and the mother of that child, if they are in-patients at the same time, shall be deemed to be one in-patient.
- 4. For the purposes of these Regulations, the Minister may classify the Classification beds of a hospital as general beds or intermediate beds and may, from time to time, vary the classification of the beds of a hospital.

- 5. The charge for accommodation, maintenance and treatment supplied Charges for in-patients. to an in-patient is-Substituted by 1957, No. 1;
 - (a) Two pounds sixteen shillings per day where the in-patient and occupies a general bed; and
 - (b) Three pounds eleven shillings per day where the in-patient occupies an intermediate bed.
- 6. The charge for a dental treatment supplied to a person, being a dental Charges for treatment specified in the second column of the First Schedule to these treatment. Regulations, is the amount specified in the third column of that Schedule Substituted by 1963, No. 1; amended by 1964, No. 17.

7. The charge for a medical service provided for an out-patient, being Charges for a service specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to these medical Regulations, is the amount specified in the third column of that Schedule services. opposite to that service.

8. The charge for a course of treatment by physiotherapy supplied to a Charges for person other than an in-patient in a general ward is Ten shillings for the physiotherapy. first visit and Five shillings for each subsequent visit during each period 1957, No. 1; for which the person receives that course of treatment.

9. The charge for nursing treatment given to a person other than an in-Charges for patient in a general ward is Five shillings for each visit by the nurse.

- 10.—(1.) For the purposes of sub-section (2.) of section 5A of the Charges for Ordinance, the charge for the provision of transport by land ambulance is transport. Twelve shillings and sixpence.
- (2.) For the purposes of sub-section (5.) of section 5A of the Ordinance, the prescribed charge in respect of the transport of a person or an attendant is Twenty pounds or the cost to the Commonwealth of the transport of the person or the attendant, whichever is the less.
