Whenever any application and statutory declaration such as are re-Investigation ferred to in section three of the Poor Persons Legal Assistance Ordinance set out in 1935 are received by the Judge, the Clerk of the Supreme Court shall for-application and declaration. ward copies of such application and statutory declaration to the Superintendent of Police, who shall forthwith cause the matters set out in such application and statutory declaration to be investigated by a member of the Police Force.

6. After any investigation has been made in accordance with the last Report to be preceding regulation, the Superintendent of Police shall send to the Clerk results of of the Supreme Court a written report giving the results of such investigation. investigation.
