

PETROLEUM PRODUCTS SUBSIDY REGULATIONS*

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Petroleum Products Subsidy Regulations.*

Claims for payment.

2. For the purposes of section 13 of the *Petroleum Products Subsidy Ordinance 1965* a claim by a registered distributor of eligible petroleum products under that Ordinance shall—

- (a) be on a form made available by an authorized officer for the purpose;
- (b) include the information required by the form;
- (c) be signed by the distributor or by a person authorized by the distributor;
- (d) be accompanied by a summary of the sales of eligible petroleum products to which the claim relates; and
- (e) be sent by post to, or lodged with an authorized officer at the office of—
 - (i) the Senior Inspector, Petroleum Products Branch, Department of Customs and Excise of the Commonwealth, Adelaide—if the claim is made by an oil company; or
 - (ii) the Sub-Collector of Customs, Darwin—if the claim is made by a direct purchase agent.

Equivalents in decimal currency.
Added by 1966, No. 3.

3.—(1.) Subject to the next succeeding sub-regulation, the equivalents in the currency provided for by the *Currency Act 1965* of the rates of payment specified in the schedule to the scheme formulated by the Minister under section 4 of the *Petroleum Products Subsidy Ordinance 1965* shall be ascertained on the basis that the amount of money in the currency so provided for that corresponds to one penny in the currency provided for by the *Coinage Act 1909-1947* is five-sixths of a cent.

(2.) Where an equivalent rate in the currency provided for by the *Currency Act 1965* of a rate specified in the schedule to the scheme, calculated in accordance with the last preceding sub-regulation, is not an amount of cents, or cents and tenths of a cent, without remainder, the equivalent rate shall—

- (a) if the remainder is less than five-hundredths of a cent—be deemed to be reduced by the amount of the remainder; and
- (b) if the remainder is, or exceeds, five-hundredths of a cent—be increased by treating the remainder as one-tenth of a cent.
