# ELIZABETHAE II REGINAE

**An Act for the further appropriation of moneys from Consolidated Account for the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1983, and for other purposes.**

*[Assented to 26 May 1983]*

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Appropriation Act (No. 1), 1983".

Issue and  
payment of  
money by  
Treasurer.

2. (1) The Treasurer may, on or before the thirtieth day of June, 1983, in accordance with this Act and with an order signed by the Governor and countersigned by a Minister of the Crown, issue and pay moneys (not exceeding one hundred and twenty million dollars) from Consolidated Account for the purposes mentioned in the schedule.

(2) So much of the sum of one hundred and twenty million dollars as will be required for the purposes of subsection (1) is appropriated from Consolidated Account.

(3) A payment may be made pursuant to subsection (1) in respect of a period prior to the first day of July, 1982.

Payments to be in  
addition to other  
payments.

3. Moneys appropriated by this Act may be issued and paid for a purpose for which they have been appropriated in addition to any other moneys appropriated by law for that purpose.
