By His Excellency George Green Esquire Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Province of South Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council.

IN ORDINANCE for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-five.

WHEREAS by the Acts or Ordinances of this Province relative Preamble of the Customs and Trade and other Acts or Ordinances of this Province, certain duties, fines, and other moneys, are or may be mposed, levied, and collected, to be paid to the Colonial Treasurer, on behalf of Her Majesty, her Heirs, and Successors, for the public uses of the Province and support of the Government thereof:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows, that is to say: That out of the said duties, and the produce of all or any other the public revesue of the Province, not otherwise by Law specially provided for, which shall from time to time accrue or become payable, during

during the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-five, or which shall be otherwise unappropriated or unprovided for by Law at the commencement of that Year, there shall or may be issued and applied in the manner hereinafter provided for the several purposes hereinafter mentioned, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified, that is to say—

First.—For the payment of the salary of His Honor the Judge of the said Province for the said Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-five, the sum of Eight Hundred Pounds.

Secondly.—For the defraying the charge of the Civil Establishment of the Province, for the said Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-five as hereinafter specified, the sum of six teen Thousand Eight Hundred and Ten Pounds Seven Shilling and Three Pence:

And be it enacted, that the Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay from time to time any sum or sums of money, for the purposes hereinbefore-mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons and in such portions as the Governor for the time being shall, by any order or orders in writing signed by him, from time to time direct; and the said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly, and the receipts of the persons to whom such sum shall have been so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.
