An Act for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the year ending June Thirtieth, Nineteen Hundred and Thirty-four, and for other purposes.

[Assented to, October 19th, 1933.]

WHEREAS, by various Acts and Ordinances of the State of South Australia, certain moneys are or may be collected, to be paid to the Treasurer on behalf of His Majesty, His heirs and successors, for the public uses of the said State and support of the Government thereof: And whereas certain other moneys are or may become payable to the said State for the like uses, under the provisions of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, 63 & 64 Vict., ch. 12— Preamble.

Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Parliament of South Australia, as follows:

1. Out of the said moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Australia, and the produce of all or any other the General Public Revenues of the said State, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there shall or may be further issued the sum of Five Million One Hundred and Sixty-one Thousand and Seventy-eight Pounds. Further issue.

2. Out of the sum of Eight Hundred Thousand Pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 2106 of 1933, the sum of Eight Hundred Thousand Pounds issued under the authority of Act No. 2107 of 1933, and the said sum of Five Million One Hundred Appropriation of General Revenue.

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Hundred and Sixty-one Thousand and Seventy-eight Pounds by this Act authorised to be issued, there shall or may be applied in the manner hereinafter mentioned, any sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified, that is to say—

Estimates, 1933-34.

For defraying the charge of the State Government for the year ending the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-four, there shall be paid the sum of Six Million Seven Hundred and Sixty-one Thousand and Seventy-eight Pounds, the said amount being appropriated as follows, viz.:—

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Treasurer to pay the orders of Governor, and discharge by receipt of party.

3. The issue and payment by the Treasurer, from time to time, of any sum or sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons and in such portions as the Governor has heretofore directed by any order or orders in writing signed by him and countersigned by the Chief Secretary, or may hereafter direct by any order or orders so signed and countersigned, is hereby authorised; and the said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums have been or are so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall be or are respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.

Power to issue money other than revenue or money received from the Commonwealth.

4. If the moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Australia and the produce of the General Public Revenues of the State are insufficient to make the payments authorised by section 2 of this Act, moneys may be issued to make good the deficiency out of loan funds or other public funds or out of moneys raised by way of bank overdraft.

Rates at which certain salaries are to be paid.

5. (1) Whereas the amount appropriated by this Act for education is calculated on the basis of a reduction in certain salaries, it is hereby enacted that on and from the seventh day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-three, and thereafter until Parliament by an Act passed after the passing of this Act appropriates money for payment at some other rate, the rates of salaries payable to teachers shall be the rates at which those salaries were being paid immediately prior to the said seventh day of October, less five per centum thereof. If in accordance with the award hereinafter mentioned any increment of salary becomes payable to any teacher at any time during the period of operation of this section the rate of salary payable to the teacher for the balance of that period shall be increased by the amount of such increment, less five per centum thereof.

(2) In this section the term "teacher" includes every person, whatever position he holds, whose salary is governed by the award of the Industrial Court which relates to public school teachers and is in force at the commencement of this Act.
