## **GEORGII VI REGIS.**

A.D. 1940.

## No. 30 of 1940.

An Act for the further appropriation of the revenue of the State for the year ending on the thirtieth day of lune, nineteen hundred and forty-one.

[Assented to 21st November, 1940.]

WHEREAS, by certain Acts of the State of South Australia, Preamble. certain moneys are or may be collected, to be paid to the Treasurer on behalf of His Majesty His heirs and successors, for the public uses of the said State and support of the Government thereof: And whereas certain other moneys are or may become payable to the said State for the like uses, under the provisions of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, 63 and 64 Vict. ch. 12—

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as the "Appropriation Act (No. Short title. 2), 1940".
- 2. Out of the said moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Further issue. Australia, and the produce of all or any other General Public Revenues of the said State, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there may be issued, in addition to all sums by any other Act authorised to be issued and applied for defraying the charge of the Government for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and forty-one, any further sum or sums not exceeding in the whole seventyfour thousand one hundred and thirty-nine pounds.

Appropriation of moneys issued under this Act.

3. All moneys issued under this Act, not exceeding the sum hereinbefore mentioned, shall be applied and appropriated for the purpose of meeting the expenditure of the departments specified in this section for the year ending the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and forty-one.

4. The issue and payment by the Treasurer, from time to the payment to time, of any sum or sums of money for the purposes herein-sum of Governor, and discharge before mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums by receipt of party. respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons and in such portions as the Governor has heretofore directed by any order or orders in writing signed by him and countersigned by the Chief Secretary, or may hereafter direct by any order or orders so signed and countersigned, is hereby authorised; and the said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums have been or are so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall be or are respectively given, and the amounts thereof

5. If the moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Australia Power to issue money other and the produce of the General Public Revenues of the State than revenue are insufficient to make the payments authorised by section 2 received from the Common-of this Act, moneys may be issued to make good the deficiency wealth. of this Act, moneys may be issued to make good the deficiency out of loan funds or other public funds or out of moneys raised by way of bank overdraft.

shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.

6. The Treasurer may out of the money appropriated by Power to make this Act make any payment for which money has been included in the supplementary estimates of expenditure of the Government of South Australia, passed by the House of Assembly for the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and forty-one, notwithstanding that the

payment is at a rate in excess of the rate which, during the period in respect of which the payment is made, was in force under—

- (a) any return made by the Classification and Efficiency Board, pursuant to the Public Service Act, 1936-1938;
- (b) any award of the Railway Officers Classification Board under Part IIIA. of the South Australian Railways Commissioner's Act, 1936-1938;
- (c) any regulation of the South Australian Railways Commissioner; or
- (d) any regulation under the Education Act, 1915-1935.
- In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
