An Act for the appropriation of money from the Consolidated Account for the year ending on 30 June 1992 and for other purposes.

[Assented to 7 November 1991]

The Parliament of South Australia enacts as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act 1991*.

Commencement

2. This Act will be taken to have come into operation on 1 July 1991.

Interpretation

3. In this Act—

“Supply Act” means an Act that is known as a Supply Act and that appropriates money from the Consolidated Account in respect of the year ending on 30 June 1992.

Issue and application of money

4. (1) The Treasurer may, in accordance with this section on or before 30 June 1992, issue and apply money from the Consolidated Account for the purposes listed in the first schedule.

(2) The aggregate of the amounts issued and applied by the Treasurer under subsection (1) and under Supply Acts for the purposes listed in the first schedule must not exceed the amounts set out opposite those purposes in that schedule.

(3) Money may be issued and applied under subsection (1) in respect of liabilities or financial commitments that were incurred or made before 1 July 1991.

Expenditure from Hospitals Fund

5. The Treasurer may issue and apply money from the account in the Treasury known as the “Hospitals Fund” for the provision, maintenance, development and improvement of public hospitals and equipment used in public hospitals.

Appropriation, etc., in addition to other appropriations, etc.

6. Money may be appropriated, issued or applied under this Act in addition to any money that may be appropriated, issued or applied under any other Act.

Overdraft limit

7. The overdraft limit for the purposes of section 16 (3) of the *Public Finance and Audit Act 1987* is fifty million dollars.
