ORDINANCE Enacted by the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

For the Further Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-nine, and for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty.
[3rd August, 1849.]
WHEREAS by the Laws relating to the Customs and Trade, and other Acts and Ordinances of this Province, certain duties, fines, and other moneys, are or may be imposed, levied, and collected, to be paid to the Colonial Treasurer, on behalf of Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, for the public uses of the Province and support of the Government thereof:

Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof-That out of the said duties, and the produce of all or any other the

Appropriation of General Revenue. General Public Revenues of the Province, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there shall or may be further issued and applied, in the manner hereinafter provided, for the several purposes hereinafter mentioned, any sums of money not exceeding in amount, respectively, the several sums of money hereinafter specified, that is to say:

Amounting in the whole to the above sum of - - £250 $0 \quad 0$ shall be issued and applied in manner following; that is to say, if any Ordinance of the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, shall be made and passed, to constitute a Municipal Corporation for the City of Adelaide, whereby assessments shall, during the same year, be made and levied by rates on the inhabitants of the said City, and applied to the City Fund, it shall be lawful for the Governor to authorise to be issued to the proper authorities of the said Corporation, from time to time, in aid of the City rates, any sum or sums of money not exceeding Four Thousand Pounds during the year, on condition that the same shall be applied to the making, repairing, and improving the streets and public thoroughfares
thoroughfares of the said City, and that an equal amount shall pre. viously have been raised, by assessment, on the inhabitants of the said City, during the same year, and paid over by the Treasurer of the said Corporation, to the credit of the City Fund: Provided that if at the commencement of the said year no such Ordinance be passed, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to authorise to be issued and applied to the purposes above mentioned, any sum or sums not exceeding the said amount of Four Thousand Pounds.

Colonial Treasurer to pay on the orders of the Governor, and discharged by receipt of party.
III. And be it Enacted_That the Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay, from time to time, any sum or sums of money, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons, and in such portions, as the Governor for the time being shall, by any order or orders in writing, signed by him, from time to time, direct. and the said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders, accordingly; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums shall have been so paid, shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account ac. cordingly.
