## ondINAVCE Enacted by the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and

 consent of the Legislative Council thereof.For the Further Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty, and for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-one.
[19th June, 1850.]

WHEREAS by the Laws relating to the Customs and Trade, and other Acts and Ordinances of this Province, certain duties, fines, and other moneys, are or may be imposed, levied, and collected, to be paid to the Colonial Treasurer, on behalf of Her Majesty, Her Heirs, and Successors, for the public uses of the Province, and support of the Government thereof:

Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, That out of the said duties, and the produce of all or any other the General Public Revenues of the Province, not otherwise by law
specially appropriated, there shall or may be further issued and applied, in the manner hereinafter provided, for the several purposes hereinafter mentioned, any sums of money not exceeding in amount, respectively, the several sums of money hereinafter specified, that is to say:

Excess of Expenditure 1849.

Supplementary Charge for the year 1850 .

Civil Establishments.

Firstly.-For defraying the excess of Expenditure for the Government Establishments and Miscellaneous Services, beyond the Grants for the Year ending the thirty-first day of December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty-nine, the sum of Two Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-four Pounds, Eight Shillings, and Fourpence.

Secondly.-For defraying charges of the Civil Establishments for the Year ending on the Thirty-first day of December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty, in addition to the sums appropriated for these services by Ordinance No. 6, of 1849, the various sums hereinafter specified, not exceeding in the whole the sum of One Thousand Six Hundred and Two Pounds, Seventeen Shillings.

II. And with respect to the sum of Seven Thousand Pounds voted for expenditure on the Streets of Adelaide in the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-one-Be it Enacted, That the same shall be issued and applied in manner following-that is to say, if assessments shall, during the same year, be made and levied by rates on the inhabitants of the said City, and applied to the City Fund, it shall be lawful for the Governor to authorise to be issued to the proper municipal authorities for the time being, from time to time, in aid of the City Rates, any sums of money not exceeding Seven Thousand Pounds, during the Year, on condition that the same shall be applied to the making, repairing, and improving the streets and public thoroughfares of the said City, and that an equal amount shall previously have been raised by assessment on the inhabitants of the City during the same year, and paid to the credit of the City Fund: Provided that, in default of such assessments being so levied and paid as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to authorise to be issued and applied to the purposes above-mentioned, any sums not exceeding Seven Thousand Pounds

[^0]III. And with respect to the sum of Ten Thousand Pounds voted for expenditure to provide a supply of pure water for the inhabitants of the said City-Be it Enacted, That the same shall be issued and applied
applied on such terms and conditions, and in such manner, as shall be provided by any Act or Ordinance of the Legislature hereafter to be passed.
IV. And be it Enacted, That the Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay, from time to time, any sum or sums of money, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such per-

Colonial Treasurer to pay on the orders of the Governor, and discharged by receipt of party. sons, and in such portions, as the Governor for the time being shall, by any order or orders, in writing, signed by him, from time to time, direct, and the said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders, accordingly; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums shall have been so paid, shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.
