An Act to amend the Agent-General Act, 1901-1941.

[Assented to 1st November, 1945.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Agent-General Act Amendment Act, 1945".
- (2) The Agent-General Act, 1901-1941, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Agent-General Act, 1901-1945".
- (3) The Agent-General Act, 1901-1941, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

Enactment of

2. Section 6 of the principal Act is amended so as to read s. v of principal Act— as follows:—

Term of office

- 6. (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3), every person appointed as Agent-General shall cease to hold office at the end of five years after the date on which his appointment takes effect.
- (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), the person holding the office of Agent-General at the twentieth day of September, nineteen hundred and forty-five, may be re-

appointed for a further term of three years commencing from the twenty-first day of September, nineteen hundred and forty-five. If the said person is so re-appointed, he shall be deemed to have held the office of Agent-General as from the twenty-first day of September, nineteen hundred and forty-five, notwithstanding that he may have been re-appointed pursuant to this subsection at a time subsequent to that day.

(3) The Agent-General may at any time be suspended or removed from office by the Governor.
