An Act to amend the Agent-General Act, 1901-1934.

[Assented to 11th September, 1941.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Agent-General Act Amendment Act, 1941".
- (2) The Agent-General Act, 1901-1934, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Agent-General Act, 1901-1941".
- (3) The Agent-General Act, 1901-1934, is hereinafter called "the principal Act".

Incorporation.

2. This Act is incorporated with the principal Act and that Act and this Act shall be read as one Act.

Amendment of s. 6 of principal Act— Term of office of Agent-General. 3. Section 6 of the principal Act is amended by striking out therein the words "nevertheless be eligible for reappointment for a further term not exceeding three years only" and inserting "at the end of the said five years be reappointed for any term not exceeding three years, and at the end of that term of reappointment may be further reappointed for any term not exceeding three years only".
