An Act to amend the Architects Act, 1939.

[Assented to 3 December 1987]

The Parliament of South Australia enacts as follows:

Short title.

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Architects Act Amendment Act, 1987".
- (2) The Architects Act, 1939, is in this Act referred to as "the principal Act".

Amendment of s. 32—
Qualifications for registration.

- 2. Section 32 of the principal Act is amended—
 - (a) by inserting "or" after subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (b); and
 - (b) by striking out subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (b) and "or" occurring immediately before that subparagraph.

Amendment of s. 35— Professional misconduct.

- 3. Section 35 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after its present contents (now to be designated as subsection (1)) the following subsection:
 - (2) A registered architect is not guilty of professional misconduct by reason of the publication of an advertisement if the advertisement is published in accordance with the by-laws of the board.

Insertion of new ss. 47a and 47b. 4. The following sections are inserted after section 47 of the principal Act:

Annual report.

- 47a. (1) The board must, on or before 31 March in each year, submit to the Minister a report on the administration of this Act during the 12 months that ended on the preceding 31 December.
- (2) The Minister must, as soon as practicable after receipt of the report, cause a copy of the report to be laid before each House of Parliament.

Immunity from

- 47b. (1) No liability attaches to-
 - (a) a member of the board;
 - (b) the registrar;

or

- (c) any other person engaged in the administration of this Act, for an honest act or omission in the exercise or purported exercise of a power or function under this Act.
- (2) A liability that would, but for subsection (1), lie against a person on whom immunity is conferred by that subsection lies instead against the board.
