An Act to further amend the Advances to Settlers on Crown Lands Act, 1914.

[Assented to, November 16th, 1916.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited alone as the "Advances to Settlers on Crown Lands Act Further Amendment Act, 1916." Short titles.

(2) The Advances to Settlers on Crown Lands Acts, 1914 and 1915, and this Act may be cited together as the "Advances to Settlers on Crown Lands Acts, 1914 to 1916." Lands Act, 1914, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act."

(3) The Advances to Settlers on Crown Lands Act, 1914, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act" No. 1166 of 1914.

2. This Act is incorporated with the other Acts mentioned in section 1 of this Act, and those Acts and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation with other Acts.

3. This Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation. Commencement of Act.

4. Section 3 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by striking out the definitions of "Deputy Surveyor-General" and "Surveyor-General" therein, and

Amendment of section 3 of principal Act— Interpretation.

(b) by

*Advances to Settlers on Crown Lands Act Further Amendment
Act.—1916.*

(b) by inserting therein the following definitions:—

“Assistant Secretary for Lands” means the person for the time being holding the office of Assistant Secretary for Lands:

“Secretary for Lands” means the person for the time being holding the office of Secretary for Lands.

Amendment of
section 6—

5. Section 6 of the principal Act is amended so as to read as follows:—

Members of
Advances to
Settlers Board.

6. (1) The members for the time being of the Land Board, the Secretary for Lands, and the Assistant Secretary for Lands shall be the members of the Board.

(2) The Secretary for Lands shall be the Chairman of the Board.
