No. 63 of 1981**An Act to amend the Constitution Act, 1934-1980.**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1981".

(2) The Constitution Act, 1934-1980, is in this Act referred to as "the principal Act".

(3) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Constitution Act, 1934-1981".

Commencement.

2. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the first day of July, 1981.

Repeal of s. 73 and substitution of new section.

3. Section 73 of the principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted:

Salary of the Governor.

73. (1) The salary of the Governor shall be as follows:

(a) in respect of the financial year commencing on the first day of July, 1981—the salary of the Governor shall be at the rate of \$30 000 per annum;

and

(b) in respect of a subsequent financial year—the salary of the Governor shall be at an annual rate determined by dividing the sum of \$30 000 by the consumer price index for the quarter ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1981, and multiplying the quotient so obtained by the consumer price index for the quarter ending on the thirty-first day of March in the financial year immediately preceding the financial year for which the salary is to be determined, and by adjusting the product to the nearest multiple of \$100.

(2) The salary of the Governor shall accrue from day to day, and shall be paid monthly by the Treasurer out of the General Revenue of the State.

(3) In this section, the expression "consumer price index" means the quarterly consumer price index number for Adelaide prepared and published by the Commonwealth Statistician.
