An Act to further amend the "Chinese Immigration Restriction Act, 1888."

[Assented to, December 23rd, 1890.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to further amend the "Chinese Immigration Restriction Act, 1888"—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows: Preamble.

1. The "Chinese Immigration Restriction Act, 1888," shall continue in force until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two; but if the Governor, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, shall have previously declared that the colonies of Victoria, New South Wales, and Queensland have passed Acts containing substantially the same provisions as are contained in the said "Chinese Immigration Restriction Act, 1888," then the said Act shall continue in full force and effect until altered or repealed. The "Chinese Immigration Restriction Act, 1888," to continue in force until first January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

2. This Act shall be incorporated and read as one with the "Chinese Immigration Restriction Act, 1888," except as far as inconsistent therewith. Incorporation.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
