An Act to amend the Friendly Societies Act,
1919-1952.

[Assented to 9th December, 1954.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Friendly Societies Act Amendment Act, 1954".

(2) The Friendly Societies Act, 1919-1952, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Friendly Societies Act, 1919-1954".

(3) The Friendly Societies Act, 1919-1952, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

Incorporation.

2. This Act is incorporated with the principal Act and that Act and this Act shall be read as one Act.

Amendment of principal Act, s. 7a—

3. Section 7a is amended by inserting after paragraph 1 of subsection (1) thereof the following paragraph :—

Payment of hospital expenses.

ia. For providing payments to registered nurses for attendance elsewhere than in hospital on members, their husbands, wives, children or dependents or for reimbursing to members payments so made by them : Provided that no society or branch shall contract with any member to make such payments in respect of any person other than the member.

the husband or wife of the member, and any specified child or children or other specified dependent or dependents of the member ; and

4. (1) Section 37 of the principal Act is amended by striking out the words " and a half " in the fifth line of subsection (2) thereof.

Amendment of

(2) Subsection (2) of section 37 of the principal Act as amended by subsection (1) of this section shall apply to interest accruing at any time after the commencement of this Act whether the report by the Public Actuary on the last quinquennial valuation was made or the scale of contributions for new members was certified to be sufficient before or after the commencement of this Act.
