An Act to amend the Holidays Act, 1910.

[Assented to, December 21st, 1922.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Holidays Act Amendment Act, 1922." Short titles.

(2) The Holidays Act, 1910 (herein referred to as "the principal Act"), and this Act may be cited together as the "Holidays Acts, 1910 and 1922." No. 1010 of 1910.

2. Part III. of the Second Schedule to the principal Act is amended by striking out the second and third lines of the said Part. Amendment of principal Act, Second Schedule—
Abolition of holidays on King's Accession Day and Prince of Wales' Birthday.

3. In addition to the several days mentioned in the Second Schedule to the principal Act, the twenty-fifth day of April (Anzac Day) shall be a public holiday and a bank holiday, provided that when the said day falls upon a Sunday, the following Monday shall be a public holiday and a bank holiday in lieu of such day. Anzac Day to be a public holiday.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
