An Act to further amend the Health Act, 1898, and for other purposes.

[Assented to, December 17th, 1925.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Health Act Further Amendment Act, 1925." Short titles.

(2) The Health Acts, 1898 to 1918, and this Act may be cited together as the "Health Acts, 1898 to 1925."

(3) The Health Act, 1898, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act." No. 711 of 1898.

2. Paragraph iv. of section 76 of the principal Act is amended so as to read as follows :— Amendment of principal Act, s. 76—

iv. Allow any offensive overflow, soakage, or leakage from any water-closet, privy, or cesspool: Penalties for permitting collection of offensive matter, &c.

3. Section 83 of the principal Act is amended— Amendment of principal Act, s. 83—

(a) by striking out the first three lines thereof and by substituting therefor the following passage :— Offensive trades.

" Any person who, after the passing of the Health Act Further Amendment Act, 1925, commences or extends an offensive trade without the consent in writing of the Local Board shall be liable to a

penalty not exceeding Fifty Pounds, and any person who carries on an offensive trade so commenced or extended shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two Pounds for every day on which the offence is continued.”

(b) by adding at the end thereof the following paragraph:—

“In any proceedings for an offence against this section, the allegation in the complaint that the offensive trade was commenced or extended without the consent in writing of the Local Board shall be deemed proved in the absence of proof to the contrary.”

4. Section 96 of the principal Act is amended by striking out the word “such” in the fifth line thereof.
