An Act to amend the Highways Act, 1926-1967, and to repeal the Anzac Highway Agreement Act, 1937-1940, and for other purposes.

[Assented to 18th September, 1969.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Highways Act Amendment Act, 1969".
- (2) The Highways Act, 1926-1967, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Highways Act, 1926-1969".
- (3) The Highways Act, 1926-1967, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

Enactment of new s. 5a of principal Act2. The following section is enacted and inserted in the principal Act after section 5:—

Repeal of Anzac Highway Agreement Act, 1937-1940. 5a. The Anzac Highway Agreement Act, 1937, and the Anzac Highway Agreement Act Amendment Act, 1940, are repealed and the Agreement set out in the schedule to the Anzac Highway Agreement Act, 1937, as varied by the Anzac Highway Agreement Act Amendment Act, 1940, shall, on and after the commencement of the Highways Act Amendment Act, 1969, have no further force or effect.

3. The following section is enacted and inserted in the Enactment of new s. 26ac of principal Actprincipal Act after section 26a:-

26aa. Notwithstanding anything in the Anzac Highway Validation of Agreement Act, 1937-1940, as in force before the day of done under this Act, etc. commencement of the Highways Act Amendment Act, 1969, any act or thing done or purporting to have been done pursuant to this Act by or on behalf of—

(a) the Commissioner;

 \mathbf{or}

(b) any council,

before that day, in relation to the roadway referred to in clause 2 of the Agreement set out in the schedule to the Anzac Highway Agreement Act, 1937-1940, as then in force, shall for all purposes be deemed to be and always to have been validly, effectually and lawfully done.
