By His Excellency GEORGE GREY Esquire Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Province of South Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council.

AN ORDINANCE to amend an Ordinance intituled "An Act to Regulate the Appointment and the Duties of the Sheriff of the Province of South Australia."

WHEREAS an Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Council of South Australia was passed in the Fifth Year of Her Majesty's Reign intituled "An Act to Regulate the Appointment and the Duties of the Sheriff of the Province of South Australia" whereby it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor or Acting Governor for the time being annually in or about the month of January in each year to nominate and appoint by warrant under his hand and seal a fit person to be Sheriff of this Province and whereas it is expedient to amend the aforesaid Act or Ordinance in this respect:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED BY HIS EXCELLENCY the Governor of South Australia with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That from and after the passing of this Ordinance the before recited provision of the said Act or Ordinance shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Regulating mode of
Sheriff's appointment

II. And be it enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty her heirs and successors by any instrument under her or their Sign Manual or for the Governor or the person administering the Government of this Province acting under such directions as may from time to time be given in that behalf by Her Majesty her heirs or successors through one of her or their Principal Secretaries of State annually on or about the first Monday of January in every year to nominate and appoint by warrant under the Public Seal of the Province a fit person to be Sheriff of the Province of South Australia which person so appointed shall continue in office until the first Monday in January then next and thereafter until a new appointment shall be made of a Sheriff who shall take upon himself the said office by making the declaration mentioned in the said Act or Ordinance: Provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed so as to prevent the appointment of the same person to be Sheriff for two or more years or to affect the validity of the appointment of the present Sheriff made in pursuance of the said Act or Ordinance but such appointment shall remain in like force as if this Ordinance had not been made.

Provision in case of
death departure sus-
pension or resigna-
tion of Sheriff.

III. And be it enacted that in case any such Sheriff shall die in his office or depart from the Province or be suspended from or resign his said office then as soon as conveniently may be after the death departure suspension or the acceptance by the Governor or Acting Governor on Her Majesty's behalf of the resignation of any such Sheriff another person may in the manner above provided be appointed to the said office: Provided that no appointment of Sheriff to be made in either of the cases last aforesaid shall continue in force longer than until Her Majesty's pleasure therein shall be known.

Recited Act to con-

force.

IV. And be it enacted that except so far as is hereinbefore provided the said in part recited Ordinance shall continue in full force and effect.
