An Act to amend the Surveyors Act, 1935-1949.

[Assented to 15th November, 1956.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Surveyors Act Amendment Act, 1956".

(2) The Surveyors Act, 1935-1949, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Surveyors Act, 1935-1956".

(3) The Surveyors Act, 1935-1949, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

Incorporation.

2. This Act is incorporated with the principal Act and that Act and this Act shall be read as one Act.

Amendment of
principal Act,
s. 18—
Power to hold
examinations.

3. Section 18 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by inserting at the beginning of subsection (1) the words "Subject to subsection (4)";

(b) by inserting at the end thereof the following subsection :—

(4) After the commencement of the Surveyors Act Amendment Act, 1956, the board shall not be required to hold any examination for a certificate of competency except—

- (a) of a person who has entered articles pursuant to the regulations before the said commencement and is otherwise qualified to be examined; or
- (b) as may be prescribed.

4. Section 19 of the principal Act is amended by striking out the words "as aforesaid" in the third line thereof and inserting in their place the word "therefor".

Amendment of principal Act, s. 19—
Certificate of competency.

5. Section 20 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after the word "furnishing" in the fourth line of paragraph II of subsection (1) the words "together with such other qualifications as may be prescribed".

Amendment of principal Act, s. 20—
Licensing of surveyors.

6. Section 47 of the principal Act is amended by striking out the word "field" in the last line of paragraph xv of subsection (1).

Amendment of principal Act, s. 47—
Regulations.
