An Act to amend the Gift Duty Act, 1968-1975, and the Stamp Duties Act, 1923-1975.

[Assented to 28th October, 1976]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- Short title.** 1. This Act may be cited as the "Statutes Amendment (Gift Duty and Stamp Duties) Act, 1976".
- Commencement.** 2. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the fourteenth day of July, 1976.

AMENDMENT OF GIFT DUTY ACT, 1968-1975

4. (1) The Gift Duty Act, 1968-1975, is, in this Part, referred to as "the principal Act". Short titles.

(2) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Gift Duty Act, 1968-1976".

5. Section 11a of the principal Act is amended by striking out from subsection (3) the passage "the fourteenth day of July, 1976", twice occurring, and inserting in lieu thereof, in each case, the passage "the thirty-first day of January, 1977".

AMENDMENT OF STAMP DUTIES ACT, 1923-1975

6. (1) The Stamp Duties Act, 1923-1975, is, in this Part, referred to as "the principal Act". Short titles.

(2) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Stamp Duties Act, 1923-1976".

7. Section 71 of the principal Act is amended by striking out from subsection (6) the passage "the fourteenth day of July, 1976", twice occurring, and inserting in lieu thereof, in each case, the passage "the thirty-first day of January, 1977".
