An Act to provide that section 4 of the Imperial Act 29 Charles II C.3 (the Statute of Frauds, 1677) has no force or effect in South Australia; to amend the Sale of Goods Act, 1895-1972; and to amend the Mercantile Law Act, 1936.

[Assented to 16 September 1982]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Statutes Amendment (Enforcement of Contracts) Act, 1982".

Application and effect of this Act.

- 2. (1) This Act does not apply in relation to a promise or agreement made before the commencement of this Act.
- (2) This Act does not revive anything not in force or existing at the commencement of this Act.

Non-application of section 4 of Statute of Frauds, 1677. 3. Section 4 of the Imperial Act 29 Charles II C.3 (the Statute of Frauds, 1677) has no force or effect in this State.

Repeal of section 4 of Sale of Goods Act, 1895-1972.

- 4. (1) Section 4 of the Sale of Goods Act, 1895-1972, is repealed.
- (2) The Sale of Goods Act, 1895-1972, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Sale of Goods Act, 1895-1982".

Repeal of section 16 of Mercantile Law Act, 1936.

- 5. (1) Section 16 of the Mercantile Law Act, 1936, is repealed.
- (2) The Mercantile Law Act, 1936, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Mercantile Law Act, 1936-1982".
