An Act to further amend the "Supreme Court Act, 1867."

[Assented to, 6th November, 1874.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the "Supreme Court Act, 1867," being No. 8 of 1867, by amending clause No. 14 of that Act—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said Province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows: Preamble.

1. From and after the passing of this Act, the "Supreme Court Act, 1867," shall be read and construed as though the words "or in that portion of the Province of South Australia, known as the Northern Territory," had been inserted in clause fourteen of the said Supreme Court Act, immediately after the words "beyond the jurisdiction of the Court." Clause 14 not to apply to Northern Territory.

2. This Act and the said Act shall be incorporated and read and construed together as one Act. Incorporation.
