**An Act to amend the Stock Diseases Act, 1934**

*[Assented to 22 December 1983]*

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Stock Diseases Act Amendment Act, 1983".

(2) The Stock Diseases Act, 1934, is in this Act referred to as "the principal Act".

Commencement.

2. (1) This Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation.

(2) The Governor may, in a proclamation fixing a day for this Act to come into operation, suspend the operation of specified provisions of this Act until a subsequent day fixed in the proclamation, or a day to be fixed by subsequent proclamation.

Amendment of s. 19—  
Duties of owners of diseased stock.

3. Section 19 of the principal Act is amended by inserting in paragraph (a) of subsection (1) after the passage "the chief inspector at Adelaide" the passage ", and the proprietors of all lands abutting the lands upon which the stock are being kept or depastured,".

Amendment of s. 25—  
Penalty for improperly dealing with diseased stock.

4. Section 25 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after its present contents (now to be designated as subsection (1)) the following subsection:

(2) Any person driving any diseased stock on any road without the permission of an inspector shall be guilty of an offence, and liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty dollars for each animal on the road.
