An Act to establish a Standard of Time in South Australia.

[Assented to, December 21st, 1894.]

DE it Enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and Preamble. with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of South Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the "Standard Time Act, 1894."

Short title.

2. This Act shall come into operation on a day to be appointed Commencement of by the Governor, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette.

3. The mean time of the one hundred and thirty-fifth meridian The time of the one of longitude east of Greenwich shall be deemed, and is hereby hundred and thirtyfifth meridian to be declared to be, standard time throughout South Australia.

4. Whenever any expression of time occurs in any Act, Order in The time mentioned Council, rule, regulation, or by-law, or deed, or in any instrument in Acts, rules, or instruments to mean whatsoever, and whenever the doing or not doing anything at a standard time. certain time of day or night, or during a certain part of the day or the night, has an effect in law, such time shall, unless it is otherwise specifically stated, be held to be standard time throughout South Australia, as declared by this Act.
