

AN ACT to grant and apply a Sum out of 1935. the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Year ending on the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, and to appropriate Supplies granted for that Year in Session of Parliament. [17 December, 1935.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act 1935-36.

Issue and application of £1,232,262 17s.

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, the sum of one million two hundred and thirty-two thousand two hundred and sixty-two pounds seventeen shillings and seven pence.

Appropriation of supplies.

3 All sums granted by this Act and the Supply Act 1935-36, out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply 26 Geo. V. No. 1. granted to His Majesty, amounting, as appears by the first schedule, in the aggregate to the sum of two million and thirty-two thousand four hundred and sixty-two pounds seventeen shillings and seven pence, are appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of those Acts for the purposes and services expressed in the second schedule to this Act.
