BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

Permits to sell

“**11A**—(1) In any case where any person resident on King Island, Flinders Island, or any other island which is a dependency of this State is desirous of disposing of any property by means of a sale by auction on any of such islands, any person may apply to a police magistrate or any two justices for a permit to sell the property, as provided by this section.

“(2) The magistrate or justices, upon being satisfied that the applicant is a person resident in the island where such sale is to take place and is of good fame and character and competent to conduct a sale by auction, and upon payment of the fee of ten shillings, may issue to him a permit to sell the property by auction.

“(3) A permit under this section shall be in the prescribed form, and shall specify the property to be sold and the time and place at which the property is to be sold.

“(4) All fees for the issue of permits under this section shall be paid into the Consolidated Revenue.

“(5) A permit under this section shall authorise the person to whom it is issued to sell by auction according to the tenor of the permit and not otherwise.”
