AN ACT to grant and apply a Sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Year ending on the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, and to appropriate the Supplies granted for that Year in this Session of Parliament. [22 November, 1950.]

B<sup>E</sup> it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act Short title. 1950-51.

Issue and

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated application of £5,987,524 Revenue and apply towards making good the supply hereby 11s. 4d. granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, the sum of five million, nine hundred and eightyseven thousand, five hundred and twenty-four pounds eleven shillings and fourpence.

Appropriasupplies.

3 All sums granted by this Act and the Supply Acts 1950-51, out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty, amounting, as appears by the first schedule, in the aggregate to the sum of seven million, eight hundred and forty-one thousand, four hundred and seventy-four pounds, eleven shillings and four pence, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of those Acts for the purposes and services expressed in the second schedule to this Act.
