

## THE SCHEDULE.

The rates of tax shall be as follows:—

For Every Pound of the Taxable Value of the Land—	Rate of Tax in Pence.
1. In the case of rural land—	
i. Where the total unimproved value does not exceed £3500 .....	nil
ii. Where such value exceeds £3500, on the excess as set forth in paragraph 3 hereof.	
2. In the case of land other than rural land—	
Up to £2500 .....	1
Over £2500 up to £5000 .....	1½
3. In all cases—	
Over £3500 up to £5000 .....	1½
Over £5000 up to £15,000 .....	2½
Over £15,000 up to £30,000 .....	3½
Over £30,000 up to £50,000 .....	4
Over £50,000 up to £80,000 .....	4½
Over £80,000 .....	5

but where the unimproved value is less than £24 no tax shall be payable in the case of land other than rural land.

## APPROPRIATION, 1950-51.

## No. 53 of 1950.

AN ACT to grant and apply a Sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Year ending on the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, and to appropriate the Supplies granted for that Year in this Session of Parliament.  
[22 November, 1950.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1** This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act* Short title.  
1950-51.

Issue and application of £5,987,524 11s. 4d.

**2** The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, the sum of five million, nine hundred and eighty-seven thousand, five hundred and twenty-four pounds eleven shillings and fourpence.

Appropriation of supplies.

**3** All sums granted by this Act and the *Supply Acts* 1950-51, out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty, amounting, as appears by the first schedule, in the aggregate to the sum of seven million, eight hundred and forty-one thousand, four hundred and seventy-four pounds, eleven shillings and four pence, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of those Acts for the purposes and services expressed in the second schedule to this Act.
