

## APPROPRIATION 1954-55.

No. 43 of 1954.

---

AN ACT to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1955, and to appropriate the supplies granted by Parliament for that year.

[26 October, 1954.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.           **1** This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act 1954-55*.

Issue and application of £6,281,373       **2** The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1955, the sum of £6,281,373.

Appropriation of supplies.       **3** The sums granted by this Act and by the *Supply Act 1954-55* out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1955, amounting as appears by the first schedule to the sum of £9,072,723, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated, as from the first day of July 1954, for the purposes and services expressed in the second schedule in relation to the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1955.

## LAND TAX.

No. 44 of 1954.

### AN ACT to Impose a land tax.

[4 November, 1954.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and incorporation.

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Land Tax Act 1954*.

(2) This Act is incorporated, and shall be read as one with, the *Land and Income Taxation Act 1910* (in this Act referred to as the Principal Act).

Rates of land tax for 1954.

**2**—(1) For the year ending on the thirty-first day of December 1954, the graduated land tax imposed by the Principal Act shall be paid in the cases and at the rates declared in the schedule to this Act, but subject to the provisions of this section.
