APPROPRIATION 1964-1965.

No. 26 of 1964.

AN ACT to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1965, and to appropriate the supplies granted by Parliament for that year. [27 October 1964.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act 1964-1965*. Short title.

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1965 the sum of £14,406,174. Issue and application of £14,406,174.

Appropriation of supplies.

3 The sums granted by this Act and by the *Supply Act 1964-1965* out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1965, amounting as appears by the first schedule to the sum of £21,553,074, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated, as from the first day of July 1964, for the purposes and services expressed in the second schedule in relation to the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1965.
