

APPROPRIATION (NO. 2) 1946-47

11 GEO. VI. No. 10.

AN ACT to appropriate and apply a sum from the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and forty-seven. [27 March, 1947.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act (No. 2) 1946-47*.

Issue and application of £39,490.

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, 1947, the sum of thirty-nine thousand four hundred and ninety pounds.

Appropriation of supplies.

3 The sum granted by this Act is appropriated for the purposes expressed in the schedule.

Power to Treasurer to apply moneys.

4 The Treasurer may apply any sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum set forth in the schedule for the purposes therein expressed.

JUSTICES PROCEDURE.

11 GEO. VI. No. 11.

AN ACT to amend the *Justices Procedure Act* 1919. [22 April, 1947.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Justices Procedure Act* 1947.

(2) The *Justices Procedure Act* 1919*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Continuous bail.

2 After section eighty-six of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:—

“86A. When a person has been admitted to bail in accordance with section eighty-five or section eighty-six, the recognisance may be conditioned for his appearance at every time and place to which, during the course of the proceedings, the hearing may be from time to time adjourned.”

Imprisonment for a subsequent offence.

3 Section one hundred and thirteen of the Principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the following subsection:—

“(2) Where two or more sentences, imposed in accordance with this section, are ordered to run consecutively, the aggregate term of imprisonment shall not exceed two years.”
