By His Excellency SIR JOHN FRANKLIN, Knight Commander of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Knight of the Greek Order of the Redeemer, and a Captain in His Majesty's Royal Navy, Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies, with the advice of the Legislative Council.

AN ACT for extending to this Colony Two Statutes lately passed respecting the Apportionment of Rents and the Forfeiture of Property holden in Trust.

WHEREAS an Act was passed in England in the fourth and fifth year of His Majesty's reign intituled "An Act to amend an Act of the Recites 4 & 5 "eleventh year of King George the Second respecting the Apportion- W. 4 c. 22 passed 1834." "sonal Property holden in Trust" and it is expedient to extend the provisions of the said recited Acts to this Colony-

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by His Excellency Sir John The said Two Acts FRANKLIN Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and extended to this Island. its Dependencies with the advice of the Legislative Council that from and after the passing of this Act the said two recited Acts of the fourth and fifth year of His Majesty's reign shall respectively extend to and be in force within this Island and its Dependencies and the powers which by the said last-mentioned Act are in England given to the Court of

Chancery shall within this Island and its Dependencies be vested in and exercised by The Supreme Court of Van Diemen's Land and the several provisions of the said Two Acts shall henceforth in all other respects be applied in the Administration of Justice in the said Court accordingly.
