By His Excellency SIR JOHN EARDLEY EARDLEY-WILMOT, Baronet, Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies, with the Advice of the Legislative

AN ACT for the general Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-six.

W HEREAS by the Act of this Island passed on the second day of PREAMBLE. January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four for confirming and continuing certain Duties of Customs and Duties on Spirits it was enacted that the several Duties by that Act imposed (subject to the payment of the salaries of the Lieutenant-Governor and of the Judges as by law in that behalf provided) should be thereafter applied in such manner and to such purposes as by any Act or Acts thereafter passed for the appropriation of the Revenue should be appointed—AND WHEREAS it is expedient that all other the Colonial Revenue should in like manner be from time to time appropriated by Legislative Authority—

Colonial Treasurer to issue the aforesaid moneys upon the order of the Lieutenant-Governor.

AND BE IT ENACTED that the Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay from time to time any sum or sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified to such persons and in such portions as the Governor or Lieutenant-Governor for the time being shall by any order or orders in writing signed by him from time to time direct and the said Treasurer shall in his accounts be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums shall have been so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.

Payments already made by the Colonial Treasurer to be allowed. AND WHEREAS certain payments have already been made from the Revenue hereinbefore appropriated by the Treasurer of the said Colony upon certain warrants or orders in writing signed by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor—BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED that the payments so made shall be allowed in the accounts of the Treasurer and that the receipt or receipts of the respective parties to whom the same have been paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer on passing his accounts for any such sum or sums of money as shall have been therein mentioned and expressed to be received and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
