By His Excellency SIR JOHN FRANKLIN, Knight Commander of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Knight of the Greek Order of the Redeemer, and a Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy, Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies, with the advice of the Legislative Council.

AN ACT for the general Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty.

W HEREAS by the Act of this Island passed on the second day of PREAMBLE. January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four for confirming and continuing certain Duties of Customs and Duties on Spirits it was enacted that the several Duties by that Act imposed (subject to the payment of the salaries of the Lieutenant-Governor and of the Judges as by law in that behalf provided) should be thereafter applied in such manner and to such purposes as by any act or acts thereafter passed for the appropriation of the Revenue should be appointed—AND WHEREAS it is expedient that all other the Colonial Revenue should in like manner be from time to time appropriated by legislative authority—

BE IT ENACTED by His Excellency SIR JOHN FRANKLIN Lieutenant Certain sums to be Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies with applied to the service of the year the advice and consent of the Legislative Council that out of the produce 1840. of the said several Duties and the produce of all or any other the Public Revenue of this Island not otherwise by law specially provided for which shall from time to time accrue or become payable during the year one thousand eight hundred and forty or which shall be otherwise unappro-

priated and unprovided for by law at the commencement of that year there shall or may be issued and applied in the manner hereinafter provided for the several purposes hereinafter mentioned any sum or sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified—that is to say—

First—CivilEstablishment.

First—For defraying the charge of the Civil Establishment of this Island and its Dependencies for the said year one thousand eight hundred and forty as hereinafter particularly specified the sum of thirty-seven thousand nine hundred and twenty-one pounds five shillings and eleven pence—

omitted to be provided for by the Appropriation Act for that year—that is to say—Amount expended for the Ecclesiastical Establishment beyond the amount estimated—for the Orphan Schools—transfer to Convict Funds—for Free Paupers treated in the Colonial Hospitals from first July one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six to thirty-first December one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven—the sum of eight thousand seven hundred and forty-seven pounds ten shillings and ten pence.

Colonial Treasurer to issue the aforesaid monies upon Lieutenant Governor.

AND BE IT ENACTED that the Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay from time to time any sum or sums of money for the purposes the order of the hereinbefore mentioned not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified to such persons and in such portions as the Governor or Lieutenant-Governor for the time being shall by any order or orders in writing signed by him from time to time direct and the said Treasurer shall in his accounts be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums shall have been so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.
