By His Excellency SIR JOHN FRANKLIN, Knight Commander of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Knight of the Greek Order of the Redeemer, and a Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy, Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies, with the advice of the Legislative Conncil.

AN ACT for the general Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-two.

W HEREAS by the Act of this Island passed on the second day of PREAMBLE. January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four for confirming and continuing certain Duties of Customs and Duties on Spirits it was enacted that the several Duties by that Act imposed (subject to the payment of the salaries of the Lieutenant-Governor and of the Judges as by law in that behalf provided) should be thereafter applied in such manner and to such purposes as by any Act or Acts thereafter passed for the appropriation of the Revenue should be appointed-AND WHEREAS it is expedient that all other the Colonial Revenue should in like manner be from time to time appropriated by legislative authority—

BE IT ENACTED by His Excellency Sir John Franklin Lieutenant- Certain sums to Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies be applied to the with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council that out of the service of the year produce of the said several Duties and the produce of all or any other the Public Revenue of this Island not otherwise by law specially provided for which shall from time to time accrue or become payable during the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two or which shall be otherwise unappropriated and unprovided for by law at the commencement of that year there shall or may be issued and applied in the manner hereinafter provided for the several purposes hereinafter mentioned any sum or sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified—that is to say-

Colonial Treasurer to issue the aforesaid monies upon the order of the Lieutenant-Governor.

AND BE IT ENACTED that the Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay from time to time any sum or sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified to such persons and in such portions as the Governor or Lieutenant-Governor for the time being shall by any order or orders in writing signed by him from time to time direct and the said Treasurer shall in his accounts be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums shall have been so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall have been respectively given and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.
