AN ACT for the general appropriation of the Revenue for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.

HEREAS by the Act of this Island passed on the second day of January last for confirming and continuing certain duties of Customs and duties on spirits IT WAS ENACTED that the several duties by that Act imposed (subject to the payment of the Salaries of the Lieutenant Governor and of the Judges as by law in that behalf provided) be thereafter applied in such manner and to such purpose as by any Act or Acts passed for the appropriation of the Revenue should be appointed AND WHEREAS it is expedient that all other the Colonial Revenue should in like manner be from time to time appropriated by Legislative Authority.
