By His Excellency SIR JOHN EARDLEY EARDLEY-WILMOT, Baronet, Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies, with the Advice of the Legislative Council.

AN ACT to amend an Act intituled An Act to repeal an Act intituled An Act for taking an Annual Account of the Population of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and to make provision for the taking an Account of the Population of the said Island triennially.

W HEREAS an Act of this Island was passed in the seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled An Act to repeal an Act intituled An Act for taking an Annual Account of the Population of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and to make provision for the taking an Account of the Population of the said Island triennially by the Sixth Section of which Act it is amongst other things provided that the Commissioners mentioned in the said Act shall on or before the First day of December in the year One thousand eight hundred and forty-five and on or before the First day of December in the year One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight and on or before the First day of December terminating every succeeding period of three years appoint one or more fit and proper person or persons for taking the Account by the said Act required and that the said person or persons should on the First day of January then following unless that day should happen to be a Sunday in which case then on the day then next following and on the days

immediately subsequent thereto if one day should not be sufficient proceed to take an account in writing of the number of persons at that time being within the limits of their respective Parishes as in the said Sixth Section of the said Act is provided—AND WHEREAS the objects of the said Act would be sufficiently attained if the Account of the Population of the Island of Van Diemen's Land mentioned in the said Sixth Section of the said Act were taken at such times as the Lieutenant-Governor with the advice of the Executive Council should direct and it is expedient that the said Act should be amended in that respect—BE IT ENACTED by His Excellency Sir John Eardley EARDLEY-WILMOT Baronet Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies with the advice of the Legislative Council that so much of the said recited Act as directs the taking of the Account of the Population of the Island of Van Diemen's Land at the times in the Sixth Section of the said Act specified shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Repeals the trienmal Census.

Census to be taken at such times as the Lieutenant-Governor by proclamation shall appoint. II. AND BE IT ENACTED that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with the advice of the Executive Counc'l from time to time as occasion shall require by proclamation to be issued for that purpose to appoint the days on which such Account of the Population of the Island of Van Diemen's Land as in the said recited Act mentioned shall be taken and thereupon the Commissioners in the said recited Act mentioned shall appoint such persons or person as in the Sixth Section of the said recited Act is mentioned for taking the said Account and such persons or person shall take the said Account in the manner provided by the said recited Act and the said recited Act except in so far as the same is hereby altered and repealed and this Act shall be read and construed together as one Act to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

III. AND BE IT ENACTED that the term Lieutenant-Governor used in this Act shall be construed to mean and intend the person for the time being lawfully administering the Government of this Colony.
