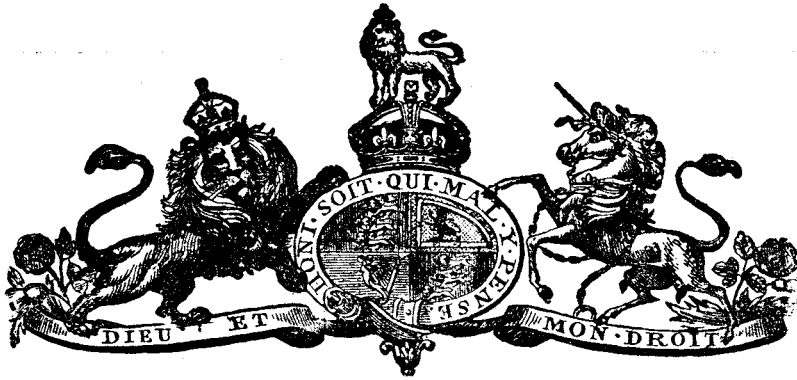

2. Land in schedule reserved as a State school allotment.

AN ACT to amend an Act, intituled "An ^{A.D.} 1912.
Act to render the Barracks-square, Hobart,
Inalienable otherwise than by the Special
Authority of the Parliament of Tasmania."
[6 December, 1912.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 The provisions of the Act of Parliament intituled "An Act to render the Barrack-square, Hobart, Inalienable otherwise than by the Special Authority of the Parliament of Tasmania," shall not apply to the land (being part of the said square) described in the schedule hereto.

2 The land described in the schedule hereto is hereby excepted from sale, and is hereby set apart and reserved as a State school allotment for public education purposes.

School Site.

Bounded on the north-east by 2 chains $46\frac{2}{10}$ links south-easterly along 7a. 1r. 28p. of land granted to Gamaliel Butler commencing at the west angle thereof on the south-east by 3 chains $83\frac{2}{10}$ links south-westerly along part of 90 acres of land located to William Sorell again on the south-east and on the south-west by 3 chains $39\frac{8}{10}$ li k and 1 chain $9\frac{6}{10}$ links south-westerly and north-westerly along Albuerastreet on the north-west and the north-east by 5 chains 77 links and 1 chain $20\frac{2}{10}$ links north-easterly and south-easterly along portion of the Barracks Reserve to the point of commencement.
