AN ACT to amend a Clerical Error in "The
Launceston Building Act."

[7th January, 1857.]

WHEREAS by the 102nd Section of "The Launceston Building Act" it was amongst other things enacted that, along with a Copy of a certain Roll therein mentioned signed by the Mayor for the time being of the Town of Launceston, the Town Clerk for the time being of the said Town should, in certain cases therein referred to, send to the Sheriff of this Colony a Writ of *fieri facias* and *capias* (also signed by the said Mayor) according to the form and effect in the Schedule to the said Act annexed marked I: And whereas by a clerical error the letter "I" has been inserted in the said recited Section of the said Act in the stead of the letter "L": Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, that "The Launceston Building Act" shall be deemed, construed, and taken to have had, and to have, such and the same effect to all intents and purposes whatsoever as if the letter "L" had been originally inserted after the word "*marked*" in the said recited Section of the said Act in the stead of the said letter "I."
