AN ACT to appropriate a Sum arising from A.D. 1900.  
the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the  
Service of the Colony of *Tasmania* for the  
Year ending the Thirty-first day of *De-*  
*cember*, 1901. [31 *December*, 1900.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

**1** Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony of *Tasmania* there shall and may be appropriated, issued, and applied the sum of Six hundred thousand and seventy-four Pounds Two Shillings and Two Pence for the Service of the year ending the Thirty-first day of *December*, One thousand nine hundred and one, for the purposes expressed in the Schedule hereto for the year One thousand nine hundred and one. Appropriation of Supplies.

**2** The Treasurer shall issue and pay the several sums to such persons for the purposes in the said Schedule mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor, by any Warrant under his hand, from time to time, orders and directs ; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund. Moneys payable by Warrant of the Governor.

Credit to be given

**3** The said Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his Accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such Warrant as aforesaid ; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

**4** The amount of pension or superannuation allowance which may at any time hereafter be granted to any officer of the Civil Service shall not be lessened or diminished in consequence of the salary and emoluments provided by this Act for such officer for the year 1901 being less in amount than the salary and emoluments voted for such officer for the year 1893, but such pension or superannuation allowance shall be computed as if such officer had actually received during the year 1901 the salary and emoluments provided for such officer for the year 1893 in the Schedule (1.) of the Act of the Parliament 56 *Victoriæ*, No. 47, intituled "An Act to appropriate a Sum arising from the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the Colony of *Tasmania* for the year 1893," without the deductions mentioned in Schedule (2.) of the said Act.
