AN ACT to appropriate a Sum arising from A.D. 1904. the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of the State of Tasmania for the Year ending the Thirtieth day of June, 1905. [1 *November*, 1904.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 The Act of Parliament of Tasmania of the Fourth Edwardi VII. Repeal of No. 5, is hereby repealed: Provided that all payments out of the 4 Ed. VII. No. 5. Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State of Tasmania duly made since the passing of the said Act in pursuance thereof, and before the commencement of this Act shall, notwithstanding such repeal be deemed to have been duly made and to have been made on account of the Service of the State of Tasmania for the Year ending the Thirtieth day of June, 1905.

Appropriation of Supplies.

Schedule.

2 Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State of Tasmania there shall and may be appropriated, issued, and applied the sum of Four hundred and thirty-six thousand nine hundred and thirty-four Pounds Three Shillings and Ten Pence for the Service of the year ending the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and five, for the purposes expressed in the Schedule hereto for the year ending the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and five.

Moneys payable by Warrant of the Governor. 3 The Treasurer shall issue and pay the several sums to such persons for the purposes in the said Schedule mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor, by any Warrant under his hand, from time to time, orders and directs; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Credit to be given to the Treasurer in Accounts.

4 The said Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his Accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such Warrant as aforesaid; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
