

AN ACT to appropriate a Sum of £800 to A.D. 1882.

Mr. Charles Seymour Dowdell in lieu of a

Tasmanian Scholarship. [6 November, 1882.]

WHEREAS Charles Seymour Dowdell was a Candidate in the year 1881 for a Tasmanian Scholarship, and obtained sufficient marks at the examination therefor to qualify him for such Scholarship, but being third on the list of Candidates for that year the Council of Education were precluded from awarding a Scholarship to him: And whereas doubts have arisen as to whether, in the events which have happened, the said Charles Seymour Dowdell is not equitably entitled to receive a sum equal to the value of such Scholarship, and it has been deemed expedient to appropriate the sum of £800 for the purpose of enabling the said Charles Seymour Dowdell to prosecute his studies at a British University upon the same terms and conditions as though he had been awarded a Tasmanian Scholarship:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

## Appropriation to Mr. C. S. Dowdell.

A.D. 1882.

£200 a year for 4 years to be appropriated.

1 Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony of *Tasmania* there shall and may be appropriated, issued, and applied the sums following, for the purpose of enabling *Charles Seymour Dowdell* to complete his studies at a British University:—

In the year 1883 the sum of Two hundred Pounds (£200); In the year 1884 the sum of Two hundred Pounds (£200); In the year 1885 the sum of Two hundred Pounds (£200); and In the year 1886 the sum of Two hundred Pounds (£200).

Charles Seymour Dondell to be deemed to have been awarded a Tasmanian Scholarship. 22 Vict. No. 21. 2 For the purposes of this Act the said Charles Seymour Dowdell shall be deemed to have been awarded in the year 1882 a Tasmanian Scholarship under The Tasmanian Council of Education and Scholarship Act, and shall be subject to all the provisions of the said Act; and the said sums of money shall be appropriated, issued, and applied in the same manner in all respects as if the said Charles Seymour Dowdell had been awarded in the year 1882 a Tasmanian Scholarship under the said Act.
