By His Excellency SIR JOHN EARDLEY EARDLEY-WILMOT, Baronet, Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies, with the Advice of the Legislative Council.

AN ACT to abolish certain Differential Duties of Customs.

WHEREAS by an Act of this Island passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth intituled *An Act to confirm and continue certain Duties of Customs and Duties on Spirits* and by another Act of this Island passed in the eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled *An Act to increase the Duties chargeable on certain Goods Wares and Merchandize mentioned in the Second Section of the Act of this Island intituled An Act to confirm and continue certain Duties of Customs and Duties on Spirits and for other Purposes connected therewith* certain differential Duties of Customs are established on all Tea Sugar and other Goods Wares and Merchandize imported into this Island or its Dependencies being the growth produce or manufacture of New South Wales or its Dependencies and it is expedient that one general and uniform rate of Duty should be paid upon all Tea Sugar and other Goods Wares and Merchandize the growth produce or manufacture of the British Colonies or Possessions—**BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED** by His Excellency SIR JOHN EARDLEY EARDLEY-WILMOT Baronet Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies by and with the advice of the Legislative Council that on and after the first day of April next there shall be raised levied collected and paid upon all Tea Sugar and other Goods Wares and Merchandize being the growth produce or manufacture of New South Wales or its Dependencies which shall be imported into this Island or its Dependencies such and the same Duties of Customs as are payable upon Tea Sugar and other Goods Wares and Merchandize the growth produce or manufacture of any other of Her Majesty's Colonies or Possessions any thing in the said recited Acts or either of them or any other law or ordinance to the contrary in any wise notwithstanding.

PREAMBLE.

Goods &c. imported from New South Wales to be liable to the same duty as those imported from other Colonies.
