

AN ACT to appropriate certain Sums arising from the General Revenue to the Service of the Colony of *Tasmania* for the Half-year from 1st *July* to 31st *December*, 1862.

[20 October, 1862.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 Out of the General Revenue of the Colony of *Tasmania* there shall and may be appropriated, issued, and applied, in the manner hereinafter provided, for the several purposes hereinafter mentioned, any sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified; that is to say,

Moneys payable Governor.

2 The Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay the said several by Warrant of the sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor, by any Warrant under his hand, from time to time, orders and directs; and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the General Revenue.

Credit to be given in Treasurer's Accounts.

3 The said Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his Accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such Warrant as aforesaid; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Moneys to be applied only to purposes mentioned.

4 The said sums of money shall not be issued or applied to any use, intent, or purpose other than those mentioned.
