

AN ACT to authorise James Barnard to claim A.D. 1899. the Benefit of The Superannuation Act upon his Retirement from the Public Service of Tasmania. [22 December, 1899.]

WHEREAS James Barnard entered the Public Service of PREAMBLE. Tasmania in the month of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, without pay:

And whereas the said James Barnard continued in the Public Service without pay until the Fifth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, when he was appointed an officer in the Customs Department in Launceston:

And whereas the said James Barnard has continued in the Customs Department of Tasmania until the present time, and now holds the office of Secretary for Customs under "The Customs Act, 1897:"

And whereas The Abolition of Pensions Act was passed on the 27 Vict. No. 4.

Thirtieth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, which provides that no person entering the Public Service after that date shall be entitled to a pension:

And whereas doubts have arisen whether the said James Barnard can claim the benefit of The Superannuation Act upon his retirement from the Public Service:

And whereas it is desirable that such doubts should be removed by

legislative enactment:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

James Barnard to have benefit of 24 Vict. No. 15. 1 It is hereby declared that the said James Barnard is entitled to the benefit of The Superannuation Act upon his retirement from the Public Service of the Colony, subject, however, to all the provisions of the said Act.
