

AN ACT to amend, so far as respects the Town of Launceston, An Act for the Regulation of [31 July, 1863.] Markets.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, that the Seventh Section of the Repeals 7th sect. Act of Council of the 5th William the 4th, No. 9, shall be, and the of 5 W. 4, No. 9. same is, so far as respects the Town of Launceston, hereby repealed; and the following Enactment shall be, and the same is hereby substituted in lieu thereof; that is to say,-

It shall be lawful for the Municipal Council of the Town of Letting the Tolls. Launceston, at any time or times, either by public auction or private &c. to farm. contract, to let out to farm, under such conditions as the said Council shall think proper, the whole of the moneys to arise from the Tolls, Stallage, and Standings of the Launceston Market for any term not exceeding Three Years.
